With a system consisting of over 90 autonomous dealers, the lift truck group provides quality materials handling equipment to the comprehensive North American market. Doosan Infracore America Lift Truck sellers successfully operate in over 220 service and product sales locations all through Canada and the U.S. The forklift product line impressively includes 63 different products consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion vehicles. Capacities of these numerous vehicle versions vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are manufactured in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest growing lift truck business in the North American market, thanks to their reliability in maintaining a high degree of client service excellence and optimum product performance to all Doosan Infracore Forklift users. The U.S. lift Truck division located in Cleveland has a skilled team experienced in Product Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

Korea's original domestic forklift market was an open-import enterprise. In the 1960's, Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. started to import assembled lift trucks as part of a national equipment expansion project. Initial sales of this industrialized equipment focused on large business communities, the armed forces and on state-run firms. This eventually led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun trade operations throughout Korea to service and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a forklift manufacturing plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical instruction became the new focus for improving quality and product development.

Daewoo started the first home-based forklift business in 1967, and rapidly acquired a massive 90% share in the Korean Materials Handling market. By the 1980's, Daewoo's progressive technological advancements combined with sales success placed them in a position of significant growth of their forklift operations.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative enterprise project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This venture greatly expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was completed in 1984 to facilitate a new plant which helped launch the business for the manufacture of high end added-value goods suitable for export. In 1993, the corporation had a international sales network and started exporting versions they had developed through inhouse technology, as an independent brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion opportunities into overseas marketplaces.
